

Grant Opportunity for Security Enhancements at Faith-Based Locations

Eligible religious institutions and community centres may apply for funding ranging from AUD 25,000 to AUD 500,000. The Western Australian Government has announced Round 4 of the International Student Accommodation Subsidy for 2023. The subsidy aims to support international students residing in Western Australia. Applications must be complete and decision-ready, submitted online with all required documentation, including evidence of an Australian bank account. Incomplete or incorrect applications will not be assessed. The programme is open to students enrolled in courses of at least two semesters in length, commencing in Semester 2, 2023.
