Eligible entities include not-for-profits and educational institutions with projects running between May 2024 and April 2025. Applications require detailing the project's contribution to the program's goals, audience engagement strategies, and organisational capability. The Organ and Tissue Authority is excited to announce a grant opportunity aimed at bolstering its community awareness program. 
National Anti-Racism Framework Consultation
